Written Comments:	The residents of Oak Grove and Jennings Lodge were told the merger between out two districts would save 425,000/yr. A quote from the Clackamas Review by board president at the time Terry John Gibson: 'it should be an easy choice for voters to create efficiencies of scale that would save the districts at least \$425,000 annually. Although a merger wouldn't mean smaller bills, Gibson said that customers can expect any rate increases to remain constant with inflation, avoiding the large rate hikes of the past'. I would consider a 27% increase in my bill as a very substantial rate hike and much greater than the current rate of inflation. What happened to the savings were suppose to have? Why do the

rate payers need to be burdened with such a large increase? I also understand that our infrastructure is aging and there is need for repairs/replacement. Do all of the proposed things need to happen now? Could the improvements be staggered to decrease the current rate increase? This is going to be an immense burden on those in our community that are already struggling and those that live on a fixed income. Are the qualifying monetary amounts for the low income utility relief program going to increase at the same rate as our current proposed rate increase?

Re: Exorbitant cost of new water meter

#### **OLWSD Board of Directors:**

I own a house next door to me at **14804 S.E. Oatfield Rd.** Last winter I installed a new bathroom in the basement of this house. In order to do so it was obviously necessary to apply for permits from Clackamas County. In the process of doing so Clackamas County informed us that OLWSD had flagged it and I was required to fill out a "Meter Sizing" matrix to determine what the total of the Water Supply Fixture Units there would be with the additional bathroom fixtures. The outcome put us slightly over the allowable amount for the existing 5/8" meter, and I was informed that we would have to upgrade the meter to ¾" in order to proceed with the project.

OLWSD charged me \$6,378 for this! It was either pay it or end the remodel project, which we had already done preliminary work on and made deposits on. I had no choice except to pony up the fee. This price is absolutely outrageous.

I've included with this letter a receipt I was sent for this fee. In the fee detail it describes "Water Meter SDC 5/8 *credit* to ¾" for \$5,665.00, but it is <u>added</u> to the other fees. None of this makes any sense.

I would like to know, in writing, how OLWSD can justify such an exorbitant fee for a meter that probably costs OLWSD between \$300 and \$400 dollars, and took one employee less than 2 hours to install.

The details of the proposed budget. 2. The proposed budget message. 3. The questions from the budget committee. 4. The budget committee rate increase scenarios. 5. The budget policy. 6. Recently, I reviewed the revised budget The two sets of documents that convinced me were the budget policy and the budget committee scenarios. The policy documents illustrated the funding balance issues and the scenarios showed the need to better fund the operating and capital balances. I did not look at the Capital plans, as I support the

capital improvement plans. I am concerned about the people of various ages and economic levels as this increase may put them in a very difficult position. I support the decision to change the name of the financial help. I am not really happy about the increase. However, based on my work experience, I am in full support of the \$25.03 increase. I believed the \$35 would have better to meet the short- and long-term financial goals. Is it enough to make OLWS healthy?
